On Monday 11 January, MCAST lectures will resume on-campus. All other online lectures will continue as provided before the Christmas break. The College will use the same procedures followed throughout the first term to ensure full entitlement to students' right to learning. Since the start of the pandemic, our approach has been based on clear protocol procedures drawn up in consultation with the public health authorities, the Malta Union of Teachers and the Students' Council.
